Coronation of King Charles III



Royston has a lot of historical connections with past monarchs, not least King James who frequently chose Royston as a stopping point for his travels. He built a palace here, parts of which are still evident, and would go hunting on The Heath. After his death in 1625 his heir, King Charles I continued to visit Royston until his execution in 1649 during the Civil War.

King Charles III will be formally crowned at Westminster Abbey on Saturday 6 May with Queen Consort Camilla by his side. For many of us this will be the first coronation in our lifetime. The Councillors, Officers and Staff of Royston Town Council pay homage to the new King and his wife and wish them a long and productive reign. We have no doubt that Charles will uphold the values, compassion and love for this country that his mother had for so many years.

News from Royston Cave

Every month last year, to celebrate 280 years since Royston Cave was discovered, we brought you brand new ways to discover the cave's story. It was our biggest output of content in a single year, ever.

And, while our 'Year of Discovery' may have concluded, this year we'll continue to bring you even closer to our story with more articles, videos, events and activities, so we can share in its magic together.

To kick-start, earlier this year we very excitingly received funding to carbon date some of the organic material, like wood and bones, excavated from the cave, which may transform our understanding of the cave's origin. A huge thank you to The Cave Trust Fund for supporting the project. We've also been featured in a History Channel documentary called 'The Curse of Oak Island' which had on the night viewing figures in the US of about 4 million and another 300,000 views on Youtube.

Back in Royston, the cave reopens for its 2023 season on 1st April and tickets are on sale now! To book, or for more information, visit roystoncave.co.uk.

Not too chilly for chillies

There's not much growing at this time of year, but Royston Allotments and Gardens Association (RAGA) says February and March are the perfect time to start your chillies and pepper plants at home!

These seeds need to be sown early – it can take up to five weeks for some varieties to germinate – and you'll have the best chance of success if the soil is warm. RAGA recommends using peat-free seed compost for germination.

As soon as most of the seeds have emerged and are showing two well-formed leaves (and certainly before they become long and leggy) you should prick them out and transfer them into 3-inch pots. The baby plants need lots of sunlight, so pop them in your brightest window.

When the plants have about 5 pairs of leaves, they should be potted on into larger pots. You'll need to keep them inside until all risk of frost has passed, and night-time temperatures are consistently over 10 degrees C. Ideally, grow them on in a greenhouse, poly-tunnel, or cold frame. Some varieties do well outside - look for basket chilli varieties, such as 'Basket of Fire' and keep them in a warm sunny place with lots of direct sunlight.

Be sure to water your chilli plants little and often. As soon as the first flowers appear, feed weekly with a highpotash liquid fertiliser such as tomato feed.
