Exciting Changes for Royston Museum



Royston Town Council and Royston & District Local History Society are pleased to announce the creation of the Royston Museum Trust.

Royston Museum is currently run by the Town Council, but its management will transfer to the Trust from April. The Council will continue to be committed to the success of the museum by providing core funding, and the Trust's charity status will give the museum the opportunity to apply for external funding.

The Museum's Trustees and their newly

appointed manager, **Nicky Paton**, will oversee operations. Having spent the last three years leading Royston Cave's development, Nicky will now work to deliver ambitious plans to transform the museum into a cultural destination.

"Our vision for Royston Museum is that it becomes a hub of culture and education; a contemporary, multi-functional space in which our town can learn, co-work, socialise and create," says Nicky. "It will be community driven and people focused, engaging broader demographics and inspiring a culture of access and inclusion. We'll be actively collaborating with the town and schools on community projects, organising an exciting programme of events and curating new exhibitions that celebrate Royston's story - past to present - and all those who've contributed to it. New facilities, new function and a new design will revive the site and make heritage, culture and opportunity more accessible than ever. I'm very excited to be on board as we progress into this new era."

Royston Town Council 2022-23 Budget

The Coronavirus has continued to change the way we live and work.

The easing of lockdown pressures over the last year has allowed the slow start of a return to pre-covid times with some hiring of rooms and halls, reopening of the cinema and limited opening of the cave. The market has continued to thrive.

Government grants have helped to make up for lost income on which we depend to provide our services.

In setting our budget for the coming year we have made the assumption that our income will continue to recover. The Royston Town Council precept for 2022-23 was agreed at the Full Council meeting on 17 January. The Royston Town Council Tax for a "Band D" property next year will rise by 2.45% from £50.90 to £52.15 per year, an increase of £1.25 per year. Due to our prudent budget, the proposed increase is less than half the current rate of annual inflation.

Let us hope that 2022 will be a better year for us all.

Councillor F John Smith

Royston Town Council was saddened at the death of Councillor F John Smith on 25 December 2022. F John was a dedicated member of the Town Council and from 1968 to 1970 and again in 1984 to 1985

served as Mayor from 1968 to 1970 and again in 1984 to 1985.

He served as a District Councillor for over 50 years, continuing as a Town Councillor until his death, a total of over 60 years' public service. His knowledge of Royston and its history was exceptional, as was his contribution towards Town Council duties.

He was an outstanding member of the local community who supported many local charities and organisations, including the Museum, The History Society, Royston and District Community Transport, the Twinning Association and many more. He will be greatly missed.
