News From Royston Cave

Nearly a year ago some samples taken from artefacts found in the Cave were sent to Oxford University for radiocarbon dating.

At long last the results have finally been issued. All five of the samples were dated to be post-discovery (after 1742) which was slightly disappointing. However, we are hopeful that more archaeological techniques will be employed in the future and we are hopeful that these may provide some compelling evidence on who may have used the cave and why.

The public tour season for 2024 began at the start of April and it has been wonderful to welcome visitors again. All tours so far have been sold out, so if you are interested in visiting the cave it is advisable to book online, well in advance of your intended day.

Looking ahead, we are pleased to announce that we will be holding some special, children focused, tour sessions in the May half-term. These will be aimed at the Under 8 age group, and we are certain that we can make the history of our town, and the cave, fun and entertaining as well as educational!
