Royston Cave

Improving Bus/Rail Connections

The Town Council have been in negotiations for Royston to become a Sustainable Travel Town. It is felt that as part of this a dedicated travel hub at Royston Station is essential. The vision is that bus and train times are synchronised in order that passengers could arrive by bus in time to catch their train, and when returning home have a bus at the station to take them the rest of the way.

Much work on this needs to be done, but there has been a first meeting with the rail company, who thought it was a good idea, and have gone away to consider the matter further. Town Councillors Mike Harrison and John Rees attended along with Cllrs Hunter and Green for North Herts Council and Cllrs Hill and Jarvis for Herts County. Also present were officers from County, District and Town Councils. We will keep you updated on developments.

Bird and Bat Boxes

Ten new bird boxes have been installed in the Green Walk and Stiles Plantations just in time for nesting season. Ten bat boxes have also been ordered and these will be installed this summer. Our thanks go to Shire Trees who have installed them free of charge.



May Fayre

It was a wonderful event - despite a deluge of rain halfway through the event, the skies soon cleared again to let us all carry on enjoying the event.
