#### **Town Council Community Grants Scheme**

At their January meeting, the Town Council awarded a grant of £500 to the Bassingbourn Squadron of Air Cadets. This was to give financial support for an Anniversary Parade through Royston on 2nd February involving around 100 cadets from the around the region. The Bassingbourn squadron recruits a lot of cadets from Royston.

Also awarded a grant of £500 was the local branch of Cruse Bereavement Support to assist them in expanding their free, specialist bereavement services to residents in the Royston area

All local community groups and organisations are eligible to apply for a grant towards a specific project. Further details can be obtained from the Town Hall.

#### **Royston Town Bus Services**

As part of their plan for Royston to become a sustainable travel town, the Town Council are looking at ways to improve bus routes in Royston.We are looking to get the Route 16 back to a 30 minute timetable. We are also working with our colleagues at both County Council and North Herts Council to schedule bus services to serve both Hedera Gardens and Meridian Gate linking to the Town Centre and the Rail Station plus Tesco Extra and the Royston Gateway stores.

#### At Your Convenience

Don't forget - there are public toilets at the top end of Fish Hill but you are also free to use the toilet facilities inside the Jolly Postie or Banyers during their normal opening hours. They are part of the Town's Community Toilet scheme and you don't need to purchase anything when you visit.

John O'Conner Grounds Maintenance joined a recent meeting of the Council's Climate and Biodiversity Working Party to talk about the Bee Part Of It project. They are working in partnership with North Herts Council to establish a bee corridor in Royston and encourage the community to become involved. They want residents, schools, community groups and local businesses to plant bee friendly areas in their gardens, planters and borders. A launch event will take place in **Priory Gardens on Saturday 29th March** from 10am - 2pm, when a range of activities is planned including making seed bombs and constructing bug hotels. There will also be displays by local bee keepers, Culture Wood and the Wildlife Trust.
